The following electronics are banned from landfill disposal and must be recycled:

- Cell Phones
- Computers & Laptops
- Computer Parts (Keyboard/Mice/Speakers)
- DVD/VCR/Video Players
- Monitors
- Televisions
- Printers Scanners Copiers Fax Machines

Never put electronics in your curbside bin.

Medications:

To decrease the risk of accidental overdose or misuse and to eliminate the environmental impact of medications in our waterways, take all unused and unwanted medications to a designated drop-off location.
